CHANCERY NOTICES

Reminder

Papers: As of January 2022, we no longer accept papers from cancelled weddings in 2020/21. All papers should be dated within 6 months of the date of marriage where required (i.e. non-Catholic baptism certificates do not need to be up to date for marriage as they are not annotated through life).

Overseas marriages

France: Birth certificates for all parties (up-to-date copies of birth certificates for French Nationals) and Declarations of Intention (samples can be provided).

Hong Kong: Copies of birth certificates

Ireland: If you are asked to celebrate a marriage in Ireland you must be added to the Temporary Solemnisers' Register. There are forms available from some Irish dioceses, but requirements vary. It is best to seek clarification from the Parish Priest of the place of marriage.

Important: Please note that in Disparity of Cult cases only, Irish dioceses now require an authenticated copy of the birth certificate of the unbaptised party. Tuam in particular are very strict with regard to this requirement, following guidelines received by the Irish Hierarchy, though not all Irish dioceses are following suit.

Spain: Copies of birth certificates and passports for all
